Fruit Bowl - Josef Albers, 1924.

While he was at the Bauhaus, Albers designed furniture and smaller objects - tea glasses and fruit bowls. Two fruit bowl designs, created in 1924 are illustrated in Bauhausbuch No.7. The design includes a round glass plate and a silver plated ring, held in place by three plastic balls. The space between the ring and the glass plate allows air to circulate to prevent the fruit from spoiling. Our reproduction is inspired by the original in the Bauhaus Archive.
